TELEPHONE CONVERSATION BETWEEN TED SORENSON AND WALTER JENKINS  
(Sorenson to WJ)

WJ: Hello

TS: Mr. President?

WJ: No, this is Walter Jenkins. Ted, he won't be back here for a little while because he's going to see DeGualle, Ikeda and Pearson over there before he comes back... be back here about 8:00, I think.

TS: I just wondered whether he had an opportunity to look at the Galbraith and other drafts ... would you know?

WJ: Well, I don't know about others, but I have the Galbraith one that came here since he left and he hasn't been back so he hasn't had an opportunity ... but I plan to show it to him as soon as he gets back.

TS: Well, I don't like to ask him to call me... will you be in your office that late.. I'm going to be here, quite a while, then I've got a dinner but the operator will always know where to reach me..

WJ: All right.

TS: I just thought, perhaps, before I started in, I ought to get some feeling about he feels about some of these drafts. As you can imagine, its kind of tough starting out "bang" for a new man. .

WJ: Sure it is and I expect you've got one hundred different suggestions from different points of view, so, let me call you for him when he gets back.
